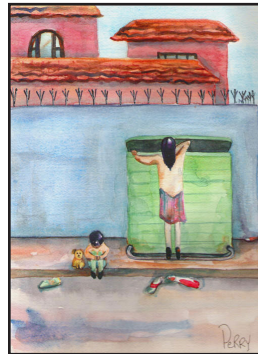

~ Every day, more than 30,000 children die of hunger and preventable diseases.

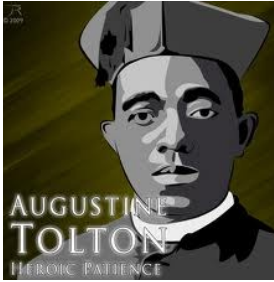
~ 1.2 billion people - approximately one-fifth of the world's population - lives on less than \$1 a day.
